

Hospitals Choose MetaVision

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MetaVision, a clinical information system for intensive care units from **iMDsoft**, has been chosen by Akershus Central Hospital, a 376-bed acute care centre in Oslo. A number of systems were evaluated before MetaVision was selected.

"It clearly demonstrated the kinds of clinical functionality that we were looking for," said Dr. Tor Buxrud, consultant anaesthetist and member of the evaluation committee. "It has advanced software and database concepts and is easy to use configure to the hospital's specific needs."

The system is now in use on the 11 beds in the ICU, which serves both paediatric and adult patients requiring medical, surgical and cardiac care.

Other leading hospitals, including the 800-bed University Hospital of Lausanne, have chosen MetaVision following careful evaluation over a year or more. Here the system was placed initially in the burns unit, with plans to expand its use to a further three units.

Dr. Paul Gerrish, critical care consultant, Royal Hallamshire Hospital, Sheffield, was impressed by MetaVision's well-designed Windows interface and its ability to access and analyse clinical information across large patient populations.
